

### **AMADA AT GLANCE**


The Azerbaijan National Anti-Doping Agency is the body responsible for the fight against doping in sport in the country. It has been established by the Law of the Republic of Azerbaijan "On the fight against the use of doping substances and methods in sport" and the Decree of the President of the Republic of Azerbaijan on its impelemntation.



Established in December 23, 2016, AMADA is a public legal entity with state registration at the Ministry of Taxes. The agency is composed of a Supervisory Board and an operational body (see table below).



### **EDUCATION AND PREVENTION**

In 2018, our team also took part in WADA Global Education Conference, dedicated to such topics as innovation, harmonization and cooperation, where they had an opportunity to convene with anti-doping researchers and practitioners to examine emerging trends, to contribute to the development of the new International Standard for Education, and, to examine how anti-doping organizations (ADOs) can enhance their education programs, while keeping the athlete at the center of their strategies.





### WADA FOUNDAATION BOARD AND EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETINGS IN BAKU

On 14-15 November 2018, Azerbaijan hosted meetings of the World Anti-Doping Agency's (WADA's) Foundation Board and Executive Committee. Meetings in Baku heralded wide-ranging reforms that lay ahead of anti-doping community.

Progress regarding WADA's priorities and other important matters concerning the Agency and the future of clean sport were discussed in Baku.





Among the wide-ranging reforms of WADA governance model approved by the Board was increased independence, various recommendations by the WADA Governance Working Group on how the Agency's governance structure and processes could be enhanced.

The meetings' schedules also included report on 2018, discussions on rules for election of the president and vice-president for "World Conference on Doping in Sport" due in Poland in November 2019, as well as a number of current issues related to the activity of WADA permanent committees.



ITHE FOUNDING OF AMADA IN AZERBAIJAN TWO YEARS AGO IS AN IMPORTANT STEP IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF SPORTS AND THE OLYMPIC MOVEMENT AS WELL AS CONTRIBUTION TO INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION IN THE FIELD OF SPORTS.

### President Ilham Aliyev

On 12 November 2018, President of the Republic of Azerbaijan Ilham Aliyev received a delegation led by President of the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) Craig Reedie. From Azerbaijani side, the reception was attended by the Minister of Youth and Sports Azad Rahimov and CEO of AMADA Shafaq Huseynli. The head of state hailed Azerbaijan's hosting the WADA Foundation Board and Executive Committee meetings, underlining the importance of the fact that a great number of participants from a number of countries from across the world will be attending the events. He also noted that the event participants' trip to Azerbaijan creates good opportunity for raising their awareness about the country and discussing the prospects for successful cooperation. President of the World Anti-Doping Agency Craig Reedie thanked the government of Azerbaijan for supporting the organization of these events. He emphasized that the participation of different countries' representatives and public figures in the events is of vital importance. He noted that he exchanged views over the cooperation issues in fight against doping with his Azerbaijani counterparts, describing the establishment of the National Anti-Doping Agency in Azerbaijan as a very important step in this regard. He pointed out that given the fact that Azerbaijan is an





important sporting country and has a strong anti-doping organization, all these issues are of great importance.

President Ilham Aliyev thanked the World Anti-Doping Agency for supporting the establishment of Azerbaijan National Anti-Doping Agency. He described the founding AMADA in Azerbaijan two years ago as an important step in the development of sports and the Olympic movement as well as contribution to international cooperation in the field of sports.

The head of state noted that National Anti-Doping Agency operates in compliance with international standards and is fully accredited in Azerbaijan. Mentioning great importance attached to the development of sport in Azerbaijan, President Ilham Aliyev added that major international sporting events, including the European Games, Islamic Solidarity Games, and other events, as well as the 15th European Youth Olympic Festival planned to be held in the country, demonstrate cooperation policy and capabilities of Azerbaijan. President Ilham Aliyev expressed his confidence that Azerbaijan will continue to closely cooperate with the World Anti-Doping Agency on the anti-doping issues.

The Working Group was established to provide the WADA with an expert opinion on effective management of the National Anti-Doping Organizations. AMADA also has been awarded the "Winners of the Year 2018: Clean Sport" award by the Sports Research Center of Azerbaijan.

### ATHLETE INVOLVEMENT



AMADA believes that the only way to actively engage the athlete community is to establish an environment of mutual trust and cooperation. And the best way to that is to involve athlete representatives both in anti-doping promotion activities and formulation of anti-doping policy. That is why, in 2018, AMADA launched its Anti-Doping Ambassadors Team and Athletes for Sports Integrity Team initiatives, which are an integral part of this approach.

These are mixed-gender teams of respected top national athletes, who support AMADA by actively providing insight to and participating in AMADA's education and anti-doping efforts. Athletes who decide to join these initiatives serve voluntarily.

Team members to take part in AMADA's education seminars and outreach activities for the professional sports community, conduct master classes for young athletes. They will also assist AMADA in reaching the wider audience to ensure public support for the anti-doping agenda by taking part in anti-doping outreach events.

Another critical part of their activities includes consulting AMADA on its ongoing anti-doping activities and providing two-way communication to the national athlete community.

### **ATHLETE INVOLVEMENT**

The first meeting of the Athletes for Sports Integrity Team took place on December 11th, 2018, at AMADA's office. Team AMADA and ASIT members, consisting of top national and international level athletes, residing in Azerbaijan, discussed anti-doping related issues.

AMADA's CEO Shafaq Huseynli informed participants about the Agency's approach to combating doping and protecting the right of athletes to clean sport, current activities, and plans on the improvement of the delivery of national anti-doping program and asked for their insight on gaining the support of sports community.



AMADA also made clear its priority in boosting its education efforts to decrease the number of cases of unintentional anti-doping rule violations by athletes by proposing to introduce mandatory anti-doping education for athletes and Athlete Support Personnel of the Tokyo 2020 team. Meeting participants backed the idea, calling awareness of the professional athletes of their rights and responsibilities during the doping control process necessary and beneficial to the sports community.

Athletes proposed to assist the Agency with its anti-doping agenda promotion efforts in social media-oriented both to the sports community and the general public. They asked for more targeted education seminars, for example, on the use of TUE.
